to be very easy to see or notice e.g., A yellow background will make the black letters stand out.
Students use colors to make keywords stand out.

an exercise in which you pretend to be in a particular situation, especially to help you learn a language or deal with problems

Language teachers often use role-play in the classroom.

information that is clearly arranged in the form of a simple picture, set of figures, graph etc, or a piece of paper with this information on it SYN diagram

fang noun [countable] a long sharp tooth of an animal such as a snake or wild dog

$>$ The wolf was showing its fangs to scare the dogs.


## weapon noun [countable] 1 something

 that you use to fight with or attack someone with, such as a knife, bomb, or gun* They all had sticks which they planned to use as weapons.

adjective
1 very dangerous likely to cause death SYN lethal /'li: $\theta a l /$
$>$ a deadly poison
$>$ a deadly stonefish
> deadly disease/virus

peaceful
adjective
1 a peaceful time, place, or situation is quiet and calm without any worry or excitement
> We had a peaceful afternoon without the children.
> It's very peaceful out here in the woods.


## estimate

verb
to try to judge the value, size, speed, cost etc. of something, without calculating it exactly
> be estimated to be/have/cost etc The tree is estimated to be at least 700 years old.
> estimate how many/what etc
It is not easy to estimate how many people have the disease.

## measure

verb 1 [transitive] to find the size, length, or amount of something, using standard units such as inches, meters etc
> The rainfall was measured over a three-month period.
